

Introduction

The year 2019 marked many developments for APGF and its members. Following a study tour and a face-to-face meeting in December 2018 in Brisbane, Australia, APGF adopted its operational priorities through to 2022. These priorities included developing a fundraising strategy, 2021 Congress Planning & Funding, online campaigns over specific issue across the region, strengthening the Secretariat, and many more.

There were many highlights of 2019 for APGF as an organisation. Rayna Fahey was engaged as APGF's Strategic Fundraising Consultant to create an overarching fundraising strategy, build a database to manage APGF's long term relationship with Funders, prepare grant applications to funding bodies, identify individual donors, and build and document APGF's internal fundraising systems. We were pleased to appoint Suresh Nautiyal as APGF's Policy Template Writer, who is responsible for developing policies on many topics that may be adopted and adapted by our member parties. Further, the position of Deputy Treasurer was created, with an objective of providing support and sharing the workload of the Treasurer, and the post of General Secretary was created, as Council believed the role of the administrative secretary had evolved over the past years. The Council appointed Anita Nautiyal as the Deputy Treasurer, and Nick Cooper, ex National Treasurer of the Australian Greens, as the first General Secretary of APGF towards the end of the year.

Furthermore, the Council happily accepted the Green Party of Bangladesh, India Greens Party, and the Green Party of Iraq as full members of the APGF. Congratulations and welcome to them!

APGF was grateful to receive funding from the Australian Greens International Development Committee for a new round of Women's Network projects, in addition to the Fundraising Consultant and Policy Template Writer roles. The Women's Network grants have supported the third phase of the Women's Network's Mentorship program, its traineeship, and an outreach program to Green women in the Pacific. Further, it supported gender equity trainings, one of which brought together participants from across the Middle East - a milestone for these parties. APGF acknowledges and is appreciative of the financial support provided each year by IDC and tithing by member parties to the Federation.

The APGF Annual General Meeting 2019 took place in October 2019 which was facilitated by Keli Yen, Global Greens Convenor with Patrick Dodgson as the Returning Officer. The new APGF Council includes Australia: Rose Read and Bob Hale, Bangladesh: Mansur Ahmed, India (UKPP): Snigdha Tiwari, Iraq: Dr Akram Almosuli, Japan: Rikiya Adachi, Korea, Republic of: Chulseong Lee, Lebanon: Imad Farhat, Mongolia: Ms. Ninjin Bum-Yalagch, Nepal: Tika Dhoj Bhandari, New Zealand: Melanie Chapman, Pakistan: Khursheed Chandio, Taiwan: Han-Shen Pan as Councillors, and Tika Dhoj Bhandari and Snigdha Tiwari as the new co-Conveners of APGF.

In the last third of 2019, APGF became actively involved in issuing political statements addressing the pressing issues raised by its members across the Asia-Pacific region. APGF issued a solidarity statement in support of the Iraqi people's movement wherein peaceful demonstration were met by violence from authorities. An open letter to Honourable Kim Hyunmee, Minister of Land, Infrastructure, and Transport, Republic of Korea was sent by APGF raising concerns over the proposed construction of a second airport on South Korea's Jeju island and called to conduct a comprehensive EIA, and to cancel the plan outright if there was evidence it would disenfranchise local communities, threaten biodiversity and/or undermine commitments to reduce greenhouse gas emission. APGF also sent congratulatory messages to the European Greens on their gains in recent elections, and videos to Aotearoa New Zealand Greens on passing of thei zero-carbon bill.

Unfortunately, Penelope Allman-Payne had to resign from her Convenor position near the start of the year due to the severe health condition of her mother, at which time Council appointed Deputy Convenor Anita Nautiyal as interim Convener until the October AGM, and the Deputy Convenor post was filled by Tika Dhoj Bhandari by the Council.

APGF had two exceptional Secretaries during 2019 - Claire Waghorn-Lees and Metiria Turei who offered immense able guidance, experience and support to the organisation. Until mid-year, APGF continued to work with the two trainees, Riwa Ghawi from the Lebanese Green Party and Rachana Shrestha from the Nepali Greens Party, after which only one trainee could be retained due financial constraints. During this time, Riwa Ghawi concentrated her time and efforts to start the APGF young greens network with representatives. During this time the young greens achieved a great social media presence on Facebook. Rachana Shrestha evolved in her role as the secretary of APGF Women's Network and provided indispensable support to the projects undertaken by the Women's Network, as well as excelling in organising webinars and working in the mentorship program. Many thanks also to APGF Treasurer Bob Hale, newly elected Deputy Treasurer Anita Nautiyal, and Shirin and Brett from the Australian Greens for their professional accounting support.

Finally, here's to all the APGF member parties for the tremendous work they are doing in their part of the world, to their dedication towards political movement and campaigns in furtherance of the Global Greens principles, and the values we share as Greens across the region.

Describe any major developments, in the past year, within your party.

All the seats held by the Australian Greens in the federal parliament were retained at the May federal election. The Greens remain the third largest party in Australia by vote. The Greens hold 9 seats in the 76 seat Senate and one seat in the 151 seat lower house. The vote nationally held with a slight increase.

The party went into the federal election with the most comprehensive package of policies ever and with a clear set of initiatives on climate change, education, human rights, improving our democracy, amongst many others. Our key campaigning methods continued with direct voter contact in person and by telephone. The party also used social media advertising extensively.

Despite all the predictions suggesting a change of government, that did not happen and the conservatives narrowly held onto government. The Greens in parliament continue to speak out on matters, such as affordable housing, increasing inequality and advocacy for first nations peoples. Both parliamentary representatives and the party as a whole continue to campaign on the streets and in the community.

The massive bushfires which began very early this summer have made world news. They are the worst ever with nearly 5million hectares burned and an estimated one billion animals, killed before the new year had begun. Australia has a poor record on conservation of its unique flora and fauna and the fires and drought combined have brought many species to the edge of extinction. The fires have brought the terror and impacts of climate change to everyone's attention and put the government on notice to act.

The main item for debate and development internally has concerned the method of selecting the leader of the federal parliamentary team of MPs. The current method involves the federal parliamentary team selecting their leader and the debate concerns the extent to which general members should be involved in the selection process.

Membership has grown by 900 (7.5%) in response to the election result in May and the climate crisis.

What do you view as the political opportunities and challenges for your party in the year ahead?

Only the Greens have a comprehensive plan to act on climate and protect ecosystems and the shifts in community awareness of climate change impacts are now more acute. This creates



an opportunity for the Australian Greens who are the only party to have consistently advocated for reducing emissions and transitioning to a low carbon economy. Our ethical, hard-working and talented politicians show that another kind of politics is possible.

What is the political situation at present in your country?

The Increasing low levels of trust in politicians to act in the peoples' interests means more people are not confident anything will change. On the other hand, more people than ever before are getting active and speaking out for change. Powerful media and corporate interests continue to try and discredit the Greens at every chance.

What is the financial position of your party/organisation?

Finances are in good shape. Funds are derived from votes at elections, donations and fundraising. The Greens are the only party which does not accept funds from corporations and consistently advocates for limiting donations from business interests.

Describe any major developments, in the past year, within your party.

A. 18 NOVEMBER 2018: The Foundation Convention of the India Greens Party (IGP) was held in New Delhi on 18 November 2018. The National Assembly adopted party's constitution and policies and elected the National Executive and the Political Affairs Committee (PAC).

B. 16 DECEMBER 2018: The IGP applied for registration with the Election Commission of India (ECI) on 16 December 2018 and submitted documents several times as and when demanded by the ECI.

C. 18 JULY 2019: The IGP got registered with the ECI as a political party on 18 July 2019 under Section 29A of the Representation of the People Act, 1951. The IGP Registration Number is: 56/476/2018-19/PPS-I.

D. 16 AUGUST 2019: IGP formally launched its YouTube Channel on 16 August 2019. Originally, it was to be launched on the Independence Day i.e. 15 August. However, it could be launched only the next day due to some technical issues.

E. 21 SEPTEMBER 2019: The IGP received its PAN (Personal Account Number) Card on 21 September 2019. The PAC Card number is: AABAI7003H.

F. 19 OCTOBER 2019: The IGP opened its Current Bank Account with the Central Bank of India on 19 October 2019. Now, the party can get online donations from the Indian citizens through this account. The details of the bank account are:

G. 2 NOVEMBER 2019: The IGP organised its first Annual National Convention on 2 November 2019 at Noida, Uttar Pradesh, which was also attended by two international Greens -- Ms Michelle Sheather from the Australian Greens and Ms Rachana Shreshtha from the Nepali Greens.

H. 3-4 NOVEMBER 2019: The IGP organised two-day Gender Equity Workshop on 3-4 November 2019 at Noida, Uttar Pradesh. The Mater Trainer Michelle Sheather gave training to the IGP women members on gender equity. Also, she trained Ms Anita Nautiyal (IGP) and Ms Rachana Shreshtha (Neplai Greens) as Gender Equity Trainers.

I. 4 NOVEMBER 2019: The IGP Women's Network (IGPWN) was formed on the final day of the Gender Equity Workshop i.e. 4 November 2019, and a 15-point Action Plan was drawn mainly for women members of the party.

J. 10 NOVEMBER 2019: The IGP became Full Member of the Asia Pacific Greens Federation -- APGF on 10 November 2019.

K. 18 NOVEMBER 2019: The IGP launched the Hawa Par Haq (Right to Breathe Clean Air) Campaign on its Foundation Day i.e. 18 November to draw people's attention towards the toxic air in the cities like Delhi.

L. 21-22 December 2019: IGP organised its first state convention in the southern state of Karnataka on 21-22 December 2019.

M. The IGP IT Team has upgraded the party website (www. indiagreens.org) and is constantly in the process of adding new much needed features to it.

What is the political situation at present in your country?

The political situation in India is volatile. We have a right-wing government at the helms of affairs nationally and there is hardly any scope for Green Politics in an environment full of social insecurity, food insecurity, unemployment, water scarcity, pollution, hatred, violence and discrimination, etc.

The right-wing government is going through its worst economic crisis. Religious intolerance and polarisation is at an all time high.

The political scenario is at one of its worst after Independence. Democracy has been replaced by a Fascist regime that has taken over almost all the limbs of the government (mainly by planting their stooges) including the President, Election Commission, Law Enforcement Agencies, the Supreme Court and even the Army.

The Fascist government formed by the BJP and its allies has the agenda to destroy the secular nature of India and make it into a Hindu nation.

What is the financial position of your party/organisation?

The financial position of the party is below average. We have been able to raise some funds for some of

our work but by and large the situation is precarious. Currently the party is very low on funds. Running entirely on personal contributions.

We are short of funds, as we very recently got a bank account and were not able to receive any contributions without it. Considering the scale of expansion that we have to achieve the funds in hand and the rate at which it is coming is not very helpful.



Describe any major developments, in the past year, within your party.

2019 was the Green Party of Aotearoa New Zealand's second full year of being a part of the New Zealand government. We are a 'support party' in government, providing 'confidence and supply'.

This was a huge year for New Zealand and the Greens, we finally passed binding climate legislation – the Zero Carbon Act – to chart the path towards net zero carbon by 2050. This one piece of legislation alone will be remembered as a key achievement of this government, and it was the Green Minister for Climate Change/Party Co-Leader who led the work.

The year was also tinged with sadness and tragedy due to the shootings in Christchurch on March 15. The Greens were proud to stand by Muslims, migrants and our refugee communities in the aftermath. Two of our eight MPs were at the forefront of work with representatives of those communities. Urgent legislation to ban the sale and possession of semi-automatic rifles followed, and we were pleased to be able to help pass this law as part of the government.

Local elections were held around the country during October 2019. There were many green-minded candidates standing, both 'branded' and endorsed Green Party candidates and others who hold our values, and campaigned on green issues. For the first time, a Green Party (branded) candidate became the Mayor of one of our larger sized cities, with around 41 Greens elected to councils and local government boards across the country.

There were two headline campaigns in 2019. The first on waste minimisation to support the work of our Associate Environment Minister, including successful beach clean ups around the country that helped engage communities in our work. Another was the campaign to address inequality. This took a major step with the release of a government report that gives us a clear roadmap for addressing poverty through changes to the welfare system. Progress on implementation has been slow however, and change may require a stronger Green mandate after the next election.

With the national elections around the corner, the Party spent 2019 developing the Campaign Strategy for the September 2020 election, including our major themes, our intended approach and guidance for our ground campaigns. The Party ran a party-wide, full consultation process to renew and update our Long-Term Strategy. The Strategy will guide our internal party and external political work up to 2030. It very clear visionary goals addressing climate change, equity, the environment and



biodiversity, and acknowledges the importance of the Treaty of Waitangi to our country.

Finally, during late 2019, details were released on a referendum into the legalisation of cannabis, to be held at the time of the 2020 general election. Legalisation was one of the conditions of our confidence and supply agreement with the Labour Party.

Summary of our parliamentary 2019 'wins'

Climate:

- Passed the Zero Carbon Bill to finally set New Zealand on a course to net zero emissions.
- Ended new offshore oil and gas exploration to protect our oceans and climate from oil pollution and global warming.
- Sparked a revolution in transport funding we've confirmed up to \$14b of new funding over the next 10 years for clean transport solutions.
- Establishing the Green Investment Fund with an initial \$100m secured to fund innovative solutions to upgrade our economy for the zero-carbon transformation.

Conservation:

- Boosted Department of Conservation (DOC) funding to save birds and delivered the largest funding for DOC in one term ever.
- Banned single use plastic bags to protect our streams, oceans, and wildlife from plastic pollution.

Inequality

- Secured \$400m to fund progressive home ownership so that New Zealanders can transition from renting to owning.
- Implemented wellbeing indicators that will measure our natural environment and social wellbeing as well as GDP when considering 'economic success'.
- Secured a youth pilot to make sure young people have access to timely and high-quality mental health services
- Been the driving force in parliament for welfare reform. We've delivered a landmark Government report into our welfare system - to put the heart back into New Zealand's social support system.

Family Violence:

 Increased the safety of family violence victims and their families, through new family violence laws interventions, better joining up the justice system to

- respond in a more appropriate way.
- Increased provisions for domestic violence victims under the new 'Domestic Violence – Victims'
 Protection Act' - including extra paid leave and a period of flexible working arrangements.

What do you view as the political opportunities and challenges for your party in the year ahead?

The main challenge – but also our big opportunity - for the coming year will be getting more Green Members of Parliament following the general election in September 2020. In order to do this, we need to exceed the 6.3% results of last election. This electoral term, there has been a significant-sized Green policy, legislative and issue campaign agenda, but a limited number of MPs to 'front' all this work.

Also, based on the experiences of other democratic systems - and early signs in New Zealand - we are anticipating challenges tackling digital disinformation activities, and in generally combating the dishonest tactics, particularly from parties on 'the right' in the lead up to the 2020 election.

Like many green parties around the world who exist as a minor party in governing coalition arrangements, our challenge will also be to continue to get the political, policy and legislative wins expected by our members and voters. We will need to clearly demonstrate where we have been able to make progress, and to differentiate ourselves from the larger parties.

What is the political situation at present in your country?

New Zealand's electoral system is a Mixed Member Proportional (MMP) which means that each voter gets two votes - one vote for the person they would like to be Parliament representing their area (electorate) and another for the party (the 'party ') they would like to govern, or help form government. The Green Party of Aotearoa New Zealand has only once achieved a 'win' in electorate vote with one MP in 1999. Our representatives in parliament are drawn from the Party List. We have three-year electoral cycles in New Zealand.

Prior to the 2017 national election, the Green Party





worked with the major centre-left party, the Labour Party, to establish a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU). Although this MoU expired at the 2017 election, it was designed to signal to voters our willingness to work together for progressive change, and the areas in which we would like to work. With the Green Party's support in confidence and supply, the Labour Party - with another minor party (New Zealand First) - formed a coalition in 2017 and ousted the conservative government of the past nine years. Overall, during this electoral cycle, the political situation in New Zealand has been one of a stable governing coalition, with significant Green initiatives and policies launched, or in-train.

The party focused to women membership and established alliances with national parties and community notables for forging alliance in upcoming local government elections.

Though, the party along with district chapter of Election Commission of Pakistan (ECP) launched women NIC registration campaign in district Kamber/Shahdadkot for four months. The campaign registered to 4000 unregistered women of the area through Mobile Registration Van (MRV) of National Database & registration Authority.

What do you view as the political opportunities and challenges for your party in the year ahead?

The Election Commission of Pakistan (ECP) has directed to the provincial government to conduct local government elections as soon as possible so the party has already decided to take part in the elections. The major challenge is financial resources for the party as the election campaign requires huge money.

What is the political situation at present in your country?

The Election Commission of Pakistan wants voter lists for the upcoming local government elections to be compiled quickly. The ECP spokesperson has directed the provincial election commissioners to quickly complete the election lists. Voter awareness campaign has been started in for upcoming local government elections. The final lists will be published in February 2020.

On the other hand, Sindh (Provincial) High Court has served notices to election Commission of Pakistan, provincial Election Commissioner, Sindh Government and Secretary Local Government and directed to submit answer on February 7, 2020 for conduct of Local government elections in the province. The Court has taken decision while hearing the petition filed by advocate Mehmood Akhtar Nagvi. The applicant has adopted point of view in the petition that period of local government in the province has completed so all Mayors and other officials are working illegally and unconstitutionally whereas local government department, intentionally, is not conducting new elections. The applicant has requested to the court to issue directives to the secretary local government to dissolve current LG system and request to the ECP for conducting LG elections in 120 days. The provincial ministers have been issuing statements in the media that the LG elections will be held in mid of August 2020, the applicant said.

Describe any major developments, in the past year, within your party.

In the national election (2020/1/11), Green Party Taiwan won more than 340,000 votes, which is the highest of all GPT history. If we are to include achievement a little farther back, GPT won four local city councilor/representative seats in the 2018/11/24 election, also the best results of GPT history. In April 2020, GPT has a new secretary-general and deputy secretary-general; they are both biological females, and this change in personnel is a manifesto of GPT's commitment to increase gender balance in politics.

What do you view as the political opportunities and challenges for your party in the year ahead?

The opportunities are that we have gained national visibility tremendously in the 2020 election, and we are now the 7th biggest political party in Taiwan. Though we did not meet the threshold to receive government subsidy and thus we are working hard to increase donation, we are now established as a party for environmental protection and for social justice, and thus we are using this visibility to plan for the upcoming two years until the next local election in 2022. The challenges will be the cliche, which is the lack of funds and lack of parliament seats to push our agenda.

What is the political situation at present in your country?

The Democratic Progressive Party (DPP) won the 2020 election and thus our current president Tsai Ying-Wen is about to start her second term (on 5/20/2020). DPP is the pro-independence party, thus on that issue GPT is close to DPP in promoting Taiwan's status as a sovereign state. Since DPP are taking a stronger position in drawing the distance from China, there is more room for internal affairs to be addressed (rather than overwhelmingly worrying about China's tactical invasion). For GPT, we differ from DPP in many areas, however, such as our stronger stand against nuclear energy and for the development of alternative energy. Taiwan is constantly experiencing the existential threat, but GPT has a unique position since we are a member of the APGF and the Global Greens (while Taiwan s not recognized by many countries and ostracized from many international organizations) so we are really looking forward to more collaboration within APGF and Global Greens).

We are making ends meet for now but we are launching a new fundraising campaign in June with an aim to triple the donation by the end of September. Since we did not meet the 3% threshold of total votes in 2020/1/11's election, we are not eligible for government subsidy, and thus we are relying on small donations from the general public.

APGF Women's Network

The Asia Pacific Green Federation Women's Network was formed in November 2015 to bring together women from the Asia Pacific and the Middle East who are working with Green parties for the betterment of a way forward for our planet and who unite to face their unique difficulties in their own countries. The Members are from Australia, India, Indonesia, Iraq, Japan, Korea, Lebanon, Mongolia, Nepal, New Zealand, Palestine, Pakistan, Philippines, Solomon Island, Bangladesh, PNG, and Taiwan. The network facilitates better understanding and action on women's equal participation in political and party structures and activities. Its goal is to increase women's empowerment as agents of political, environmental, and social change.

APGFWN hosts monthly meetings and webinars on key topics via Social communication medium where we discuss what is happening internally and within our respective countries as well as means to strengthen women's rights regionally. It is a bitter truth that women have faced the key challenge of social, economic, and cultural situations throughout the world. It is a key aim of the network to Motivate, Support, Inspire, Train, and Develop more women within the Green parties of APGF. APGFWN has developed and run many projects since 2017 with the Help of the Australian Greens International Development Committee (IDC).

Asia Pacific Green Federation Women Network (APGFWN) through project support from the Australian Greens International Development Committee (IDC) has implemented a Gender Equity Online Toolkit; for the third year running a successful Mentorship & Webinar program, and in 2019 we started our in-country Gender Equity training with a pilot project in India. The overarching objectives were to:

- Have Gender Equity adopted inside the Green parties of APGF with equal representation and participation of women
- Improve the confidence and skills of women through training and motivational programs.

Gender Equity Toolkit

The Gender Equity Toolkit was developed to provide assistance to APGF member parties to increase women's participation as party members, leaders, and candidates in conjunction with the Gender Equity Roadmap adopted by APGF Council in Brisbane in Dec 2018. Gender Equity Implementation

In 2019 APGFWN the First Gender Equity Implementation training Workshop was held in India with the India Greens party. A two-day training program was conducted with 18 women members from the India Greens party which resulted in creating a national Women's Network for the party and developed a two-year road map and action plan for the Women's Network. A half-day Gender Sensitivity Training was also conducted for men and women at the party.

The next Gender Equity Implementation training is scheduled in Bangladesh and the planning of training on Nepal, Pakistan, and the Middle East is now in the process.

Mentorship/Webinar Project

The Mentorship Program has been a special program and learning opportunity for Women in APGF Countries. To Date, 15 women Leaders from APGF have been mentored by 14 amazing women leaders from across the world. This has helped women take on key positions, stand as candidates for election, recruitment of more women party members, introducing a buddy system, and developing policies relevant to women in APGF member Parties.

APGFWN has conducted 17 Webinars in the last three years on topics such as Women in Leadership, Indigenous People and Climate Change, The Role of Women in Setting up Green Parties, Women and Water, Women, and Forests.

Pacific Women's Outreach

The Pacific Women's' Outreach (Matariki project) is an ongoing project of APGFWN from 2019/20. The main purpose of the Matariki Pacific Outreach Project is to develop a network of Pacific women involved in Green activities in Polynesian, Melanesian, and Micronesian countries and connect them to the Asia Pacific Greens Women's Network. Overall progress is beginning to be made in some national parties for an equal participation of women in leadership positions, a spokesperson, and as candidates for upcoming elections.
